### World War 2 - 1942

*John Thompson Strategic analyst quotes from his book "Spirit Over Steel"*

**Feb 8<sup>th</sup>:** General Homma calls for more reinforcements in the Philippines, American resistance thus far has been more formidable than was planned on. The 5<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> and Imperial Guard Divisions stage a successful crossing onto Singapore Island.

**Feb 10<sup>th</sup>:** The Pacific War Council (UK, Australia, Netherlands, and New Zealand) meets in London. The British defence on Singapore falters, partly because of confused communications – again. Japanese forces cross the Salween in Burma.

**Feb 11<sup>th</sup>:** The Japanese on the northern edge of Singapore Island easily fend off a counterattack; the defenders retire to the City of Singapore itself. Scharnhorst, Gneisenau and Prinz Eugen start their run up the English Channel – en route to home ports that aren't in easy range of British bombers.

**Feb 12<sup>th</sup>:** Japanese soldiers on Banka Island in Indonesia murder a number of survivors from a vessel that sank after it fled Singapore: Among those dead are several dozen wounded and 21 Australian nurses who were deliberately machine gunned by Japanese infantrymen. Inattentiveness has its price, Scharnhorst, Gneisenau, Prinz Eugen and their escorts brush off minor British attacks in their ‘Channel Dash’ and make it into the North Sea en route to Norway. One attack brings much German admiration for the naked courage of six Swordfish torpedo bombers which flew into a storm of flak in a failed attempt to hit Scharnhorst, with only five of the 18 crewmen surviving the complete destruction of their squadron. Lt Cdr Eugene Esmonde, an Irishman in the Royal Navy’s Fleet Air Arm, led the attack and receives a posthumous Victoria Cross.

**Feb 13<sup>th</sup>:** German Resistance has firmed up since December, but Soviet raiding detachments have now reached as far as Belarus. Britain can rest easy; the German plans for Operation Sealion are finally and officially shelved. Matvey Kuzmitch Kuzmin is an 83 year old man, and no friend of the Communist Party; but when he is paid to guide German troops along a back route to the Soviet defences on the Malkino Heights, the elderly poacher sees to it they walk into a pre-arranged ambush. During the fight, the German officer who engaged Kuzmin as a guide kills him; but Kuzmin posthumously becomes the oldest man ever inducted into the ranks of Hero of the Soviet Union as a warrior.

**Feb 14<sup>th</sup>:** Faced with the chronic inaccuracy of night bombing, the RAF decides to start deliberately “wide bombing” in industrial cities and attack civilians. Japanese paratroopers descend on Palembang on Sumatra. In a time of despair and defeat, the brave resolve to go down fighting... One such is a 43 year old temporary Lieutenant in the Royal Naval Reserve aboard a beat up passenger steamer converted into a gun boat. But when Thomas Wilkinson sights two Japanese convoys and their escorts in the Java Sea off Malaya, he tells the crew of HMS Li Wo that he will engage the foe to the end. His men snarl their agreement and bring their tramp steamer to battle – they set a Japanese transport on fire and duel a cruiser for an hour before their vessel is sunk by gunfire. Lt Wilkinson is posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross to recognize a valiant ship and crew
