World War 2 – 1943

John Thompson Strategic analyst - quotes from his book "Spirit Over Steel"

Jan 2nd: The Japanese finally manage to contain the expansion of US Marine holdings on Cape Gloucester, although mud and the incessant rain have much more to do with this. The Soviets advance to within 30km of the 1939 Polish border. Elements of US 32nd Division land at Saidor on New Guinea and grab the harbor and airfield.

Jan 3rd: The Soviets continue to move west and southwest of Korosten.

Jan 4th: The Soviet offensive in the Ukraine continues, this time to the south of Kiev. Sherman's carriers are bashing the Japanese on New Ireland today. Spearheaded by the British 46th Division, 5th Army starts to attack towards the Gustav line in Italy along a 10 mile front. Robert Klein, a Soviet officer, receives the award Hero of the Soviet Union for his actions near Cherkassy in late 1943. There's a catch: Klein's heroism was performed while wearing the uniform of an officer of the German General Staff. During his masquerade, he had prevented the withdrawal of elements of 4th Panzer Army and convinced German engineers to remove the demolition charges from a vital bridge. When asked for his orders by a stressed Panzer officer, he had drawn his pistol and threatened a summary execution on the spot. His ruse snarled the withdrawal of German forces and enabled heavier casualties to be inflicted on them by pursuing Soviet troops.

Jan 5th: Vatutin's 1st Ukrainian Front captures Berchidev, southwest of Kiev, while Konev's 2nd Ukrainian Front starts driving on Kirovograd. American and Australian forces are moving on the Japanese at Saidor and the Huon Peninsula on New Guinea.

Jan 6th: The Marines on Cape Gloucester expand south of their beachhead to the Aogiri River – the deep mud and incessant heavy rains make all progress very slow. The Polish town of Rakotino gets to see the Soviet Army arrive for the second time in 5 years.

Jan 7th: The German defenders of Kirovograd are weakening, and the Soviets occupy the old (pre-1939) Polish city of Rovno. British and US elements of 5th Army clear the peaks of Monte Porchia and Monte Chiaia. Facing losses among his U-Boats, Doenitz abandons Wolf-Pack tactics and deploys his boats individually.

Jan 8th: Kirovograd is back in Soviet hands. Count Ciano and de Bono are now in Mussolini's uncharitable hands and are on trial in Verona for helping to overthrowing Benito last summer.

Essential Reading: Galeazzo Ciano was Mussolini's son-in-law and a sometime foreign minister as well as a senior figure in the Fascist Party; he was also a consummate diarist. The diary survived the war, Ciano did not. However, his candid inside observations about high figures in the Fascist and Nazi party were engaging material when first published in 1946. However, the full English translation of his entire diaries had to wait until 2002 and this

version is the one that should be acquired for any good collection on the war. Seek out Galeazzo Ciano, Diaries 1937-1943, translated by Robert L Miller and published by Enigma Books in 2002
